Sheriff's Posse hosts the Annual Ranch Rodeo the second weekend of September. The Ranch Rodeo consists of approximately 16 teams competing in various events. Events include saddle bronc riding, stray gathering, mutton busting, trailer loading for men and ladies, team doctrin' and wild cow milking. Events are scheduled Friday for some of the teams with the others competing on Saturday. There is entertainment during the rodeo. The Ranch Rodeo performances will be Friday at 7:30pm, Saturday at 10:30am and Saturday at 7:30pm. Saturday night will boast a Chuck Wagon Cook-Off at 6:00pm. Tickets may be purchased for dinner from the chuckwagons. A trade show will take place throughout the Ranch Rodeo. Tickets for Friday performances are \$10 and Saturday tickets are \$15 and include all day and the dance afterwards.





"The Cutting Horse Capital of the World" is an international distinction for the city of Weatherford. With more cutting horses per capita than any other city, you can catch a weekend event almost anytime, plus the world's richest cutting competitions are held three times a year in Fort Worth, just a twenty-minute drive away.

The Brazos Bash, among the top ten cutting events in the nation, is held in Weatherford during the last week of September.





Parker County is home to over 30 cutting horse ranches. It is the hub of the cutting horse industry including equine hospitals, many of the well known trainers and riders, as well as collaborative industries such as boot making, hat making, etc. Tours can be arranged to include any or all of these. The mission of The Doss Heritage and Culture Center is to collect, preserve & interpret the history of Parker County through cultural and educational events that raise community awareness and pride in our western heritage. Visitors are taken back to the early 1800's, when Charles Goodnight drove cattle through Parker County on the legendary trail named in his honor. In addition to rugged pioneers, Weatherford has been home to celebrity artists and actors. The Doss Heritage and Culture Center brings Parker County history to life through exhibits of clothing, tools, furnishings, art and writings. Educational programs and exhibits focus on a wide range of history.

Vintage Buildings


Brownstone Chapel

Historic Homes:



Perhaps Weatherford's greatest treasure is the abundance of historic homes and buildings. More than 60 Queen Anne, Victorian and other architecturally significant homes built at the turn of the century sit along the treelined avenues where horse-drawn carriages once carried the pillars of the community.

Chandor Gardens



Chandor Gardens is a special place that blends the classic elegance of the traditional English gardens with the dramatic design and bold features of the Chinese gardens. Created from a limestone hilltop, this unique estate garden is the brilliant vision of famed portrait artist Douglas Chandor (1897-1953). His passion for art and beauty are expressed in the Garden's ingenious layout, rich with water features, intricate stonework, timeless sculpture, and delightful surprises around every corner.

Chandor Gardens is a splendid setting for weddings, retreats, special events, private parties and tours. The 3.5 acre garden and 5600 square foot mansion may be rented together or separately and accommodate groups of up to 200 guests. Chandor Gardens is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Lake Weatherford is east of Weatherford off US 80/ 180. The lake has a maximum depth of 39 feet and fluctuates 2 to 8 feet annually. Predominant fish species are largemouth bass, white bass, crappie, channel catfish and sunfish. The marina handles the activity for the lake. Recently added is the Boardwalk that runs from East Lake Dr. to West Lake Dr. below FM 730 bridge. Besides the floating walkway there is a walking trail, fishing/kayak launch pier, restrooms, pavilion and playground.

Amphitheater

Heritage Park offers the community a safe environment for events that are within close proximity to downtown and centrally located to the community. Heritage Park spans 62 acres and is home to the Event Center, Patsy Hooks Dog Park and Food Park and hosts First Monday Trade Days on a monthly basis. The amphitheater

attracts more tourism and positions Weatherford as an entertainment hub outside the DFW area. It seats 1500-2000 with additional space for handicap accessibility. In addition, the amphitheater has state-of-theart audio technology

and opportunities for stage lighting during larger events. Summer concert series bring local, regional and

> notable artists to the Heritage Park amphitheater. Local theater groups are featured for both both small and large productions.



Food Truck Park



Town Creek Hike & Bike Trail: As the Town Creek Hike & Bike Trail meanders through the heart of Weatherford, travelers will enjoy the natural woodland setting along the creek. One highlight of the pathway is the stop in Holland Lake Park. The park includes a playground, picnic facilities, bike racks, athletic fields, restrooms, a pond with fishing and parking areas. Other trailheads are located at the Weatherford Police Station, Bose Ikard Elementary school and the Chamber of Commerce. The trail is 3.3 miles of concrete, open to hikers and bikers with no motorized vehicles allowed.


Statues





Now known as the Cutting Horse Capital of the World, Weatherford is home to hundreds of professional trainers, Hall-of-Fame horses and a breathtaking, life-size bronze cutting horse. The bronze statue which stands in front of the Chamber office was sculpted by Kelly Graham. almost 2000 lbs. and is the largest & heaviest bronze done by Graham. It was unveiled in 1999.







The Peter Pan statue is located in front of the Weatherford Public Library at 1214 Charles Street. The statue is a bronze likeness of actress Mary Martin's ever-youthful character of Peter Pan, a role she made famous on Broadway and 2 TV presentations. Sculpted by Ronald Thomason and cast by Metz Castleberry, the statue was dedicated on July 4, 1976. A plaque at the base reads,





"A tribute to the genius of Weatherford's Mary Martin who brought a myth to life for America's millions.": In 1963, a previous statue of Mary Martin's Peter Pan was dedicated at Cherry Park.

Around Town

The memory of Weatherford's favorite son, Larry Hagman, was immortalized on Sept. 21, 2014, when a statue of the late actor was unveiled at the Doss Heritage & Culture Center. Larry became a true TV star in 1965 in the comedy series, "I Dream of Jeannie," in which he played an amiable astronaut whose life is plagued by a beautiful blonde genie, portrayed by Barbara



Eden. It wasn't until 1977, when "Dallas' came along, however, that Larry's career took off again. Larry Hagman became J.R. Ewing, the despicable, corrupt, merciless millionaire, the man everyone loved to hate.
